Place refuse and recycling out only on morning of scheduled collection

Refuse placed out the night before collection is subject to wind, rain, animals and vandalism for many hours before it is collected. Piles of trash on the sidewalk also do not present a favorable atmosphere for patrons of restaurants and other businesses in the evening. The Public Works Department schedules refuse collection in the downtown late enough in the morning to allow merchants to arrive at their shops at a reasonable hour and place their refuse out for collection. When placing refuse out for collection, please do not place it in a trash can or other receptacle not intended to be removed with the refuse.

The City strongly encourages merchants to participate in the weekly (Wednesday) recycling collection. However, the crew that collects the boxes is not able to collect boxes full of packing "peanuts" or other refuse.
